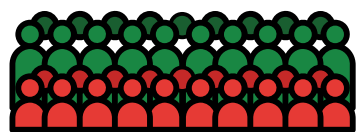


THE LATEST FROM ZVANDIRI APRIL TO JUNE 2019



64,145

children, adolescents and young people living with HIV received Zvandiri services across **51 districts** of Zimbabwe, through **home visits, support groups and ART refill groups, clinic visits and MHealth**



Led by **1,042 trained, mentored CATS**, integrated in **613 health facilities**, supervised by Nurses and Primary Counsellors, with technical assistance from **49 Zvandiri Mentors** and **42 Zvandiri interns**.

4,822 children, adolescents and young people tested for HIV through index case finding

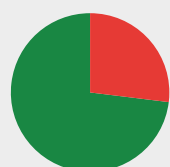

50% received their results

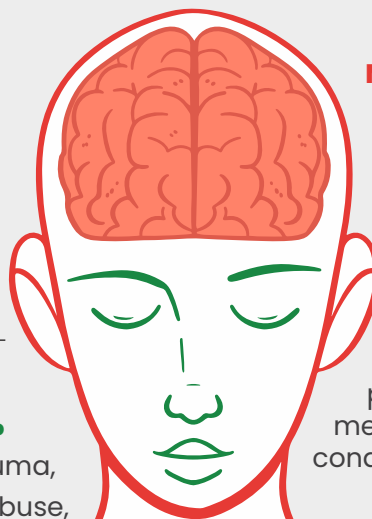


72% virologically suppressed

46% with depression, **33%** anxiety, **12%** trauma, **5%** substance abuse, **4%** psychosis

Pilot of CATS-led, community based active case finding in Mashonaland West.



119 CATS trained to **screen** for TB, **mobilise** for IPT and refer to TB services.



137 screened positive for TB



4 diagnosed with TB



18 commenced on IPT



99.4% of their babies are **HIV negative**



53% of Young Mothers found to have **common mental conditions** and referred for enhanced counselling

Operations research completed and **177** mother baby pairs assessed to explore the clinical and psychosocial status of HIV positive young mums and their babies



2.8% of babies found to have developmental delays and referred for management

169 children identified and referred for disability services



36 hearing challenges



27 visual challenges



17 reported learning challenges



12 mobility challenges

PMTCT



72 trained and mentored Young Mentor Mothers supporting **1170** pregnant or breastfeeding young mothers in **38** health facilities.



97% of the young mothers have undetectable viral loads.

CATS HEALTH

843 CATS Health Assessments



90% bled for Viral Load in last 12 months



92% virologically suppressed



3 deaths – PCP, meningitis, drowning accident



733 screened for TB



21% screened positive

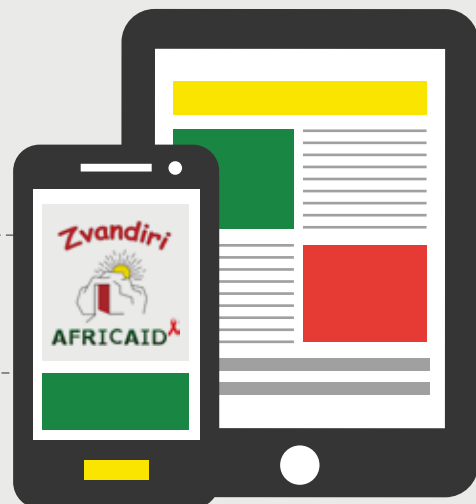

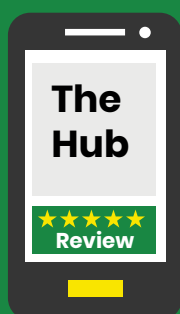
6 U Reporters responded to 199 cases received via U-report dashboard

Revised Zvandiri implementation tools and **'The Hub'** app reviewed with MoHCC for finalisation

Continued strengthening of ZVAMODA for real team data capturing and case management of Zvandiri clients



13 episodes of the Zvandiri Radio Show broadcast on ZiFM

5 episodes were streamed live, reaching a total of 6885 viewers



Radio Show presenters included 6 Zvandiri Mentors, 20 adolescents and **6 young mothers**
18 vox pops were submitted by young reporters.



Beyond Zimbabwe



NIGERIA

- Planning for site visit to Zvandiri in August 2019, by The Institute of Human Virology (IHV), CDC and MoH.

GHANA

- Planning for future partnership – Sourcing funding through Global Fund to implement Zvandiri locally.
- Planning for site visit to Zvandiri in August/September 2019.

CAMEROON

- Sharing of Zvandiri at the MOH-WHO paediatric and adolescent TWG meeting.

DRC

- Sharing of Zvandiri at the MOH-WHO paediatric and adolescent TWG meeting

NAMIBIA

- MOU with MOH in place – awaiting signing with Namibia Attorney General.
- Baseline assessment and CATS training to follow after signing of MOU.

UGANDA

- 57 YAPS trained – More YAPS being trained. First Mentorship Scheduled for September 2019.

TANZANIA

- CATS' mentorship and supervision survey conducted in 7 health facilities
- 59 active CATS and 23 inactive CATS reached with survey.
- 66 CATS supporting 2362 ALHIV

MALAWI

- MOH interested in adopting the model; Communication underway with local IP, One Community (OC).

ESWATINI

- CATS' mentorship and supervision survey conducted in 10 health facilities
- 30 active CATS AND 47 inactive CATS reached with the survey.
- WHO and MOH meeting with Africaid Frontline and Congo to consider scale up of the model
- 1242 CAYPLHIV reached by 48 CATS.

RWANDA

- MoU Signed with local IP Dream Village & Rwanda Biomedical Centre (RBC) facilitating for the adoption of Zvandiri.
- Baseline Assessment for Dream Village and 10 Health Facilities. Trained 20 CATS and subsequent attachment to Health Facilities (June 2019).
- Mentorship planned July 2019

MOZAMBIQUE

- CATS' mentorship and supervision survey conducted in 4 health facilities
- 19 active CATS and 14 inactive CATS reached with the survey.
- 1297 CAYPLHIV reached by 33 CATS
